

Rules for Starting a Resident Club in Cureton

The Board does not control formation of clubs.

The Board only requires a brief description of the club's intended purpose, mission statement or goals and the named individual that has responsibility for the intended club. When accepted by the Board, This information will be placed on our website for informational purposes.

Use of the clubhouse by a club for Cureton residents only, the clubhouse is available at no charge.

When the clubhouse is used by a club and has members from the general public or anyone that does not live in our Cureton Community, then standard rental fees and deposit apply.

Anyone interested in starting a club should contact the chair or co-chair of the clubhouse committee to reserve a time for the club meetings. This is necessary so a clubhouse committee member can be assigned to open and close for the club and to make sure there is no scheduling conflict.

Use of the clubhouse by a club will have responsibility for cleaning of the clubhouse after the meetings and for any damage resulting from the meetings. The clubhouse member that opens and closes for each club will provide a cleanup checklist.

The above rules/guidelines should be followed. Any infraction of the rules/guidelines may constitute loss of use of the clubhouse.
